

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Introduction and report contents

This report sets out the overall results from the UK Pollinator Monitoring Scheme (PoMS) 2022 participants' questionnaire.

There were 424 responses to the questionnaire overall.

The online questionnaire was open between 11th February and 7th March 2022. It was promoted by the UK Centre for Ecology and Hydrology (UKCEH) to everyone who had signed-up to the UK Pollinator Monitoring Scheme (PoMS) since it began in 2017.

The questionnaire contained a range of opinion-scale and tick-box questions to gather information on factors that may be motivating or discouraging participants and/or potentially interested newcomers. The questionnaire also contained open questions to gain qualitative insight into what most enriches, or limits, the PoMS participant experience.











This top-to-bottom chart shows the responses in order of most answers given to least answers given. Respondents were asked to tick all motivations that applied to them.



PoMS participation enjoyment factors

The 365 active PoMS participants were asked to select answers from a tick box list about what they most enjoy. They were asked this question relevant to the type of the survey they carried out (i.e. FIT Count, 1km square survey, or both). 
Perceptions of the PoMS participation experience

All respondents who stated that they have submitted data (for either the FIT Count, the 1km square survey, or both) were asked to answer two sets of opinion questions about their experience as a PoMS participant. For each question, respondents were asked to select an option from an opinion scale – from *Strongly Disagree* to *Strongly Agree*.

Summary of agree responses

This chart orders the 'total agree' percentages (the sum of the *Agree* and *Strongly Agree* answers) for each of the 21 opinion questions from most satisfied to least satisfied.


PoMS Participants top and bottom total agree responses




Detailed opinion-scale responses




2. I found it straightforward to follow the survey method












6. I felt well supported by the PoMS team during my survey




7. I didn't have any problems getting to / travelling to the 1 km square survey site (1 km sq surveys only)




8. I appreciate the expenses options offered to me (1 km sq surveys only)



9. I didn't have any problems following the survey route to pan trap stations (1 km sq surveys only)





Section 2: Overall experience as a PoMS participant

Benchmark comparison:


In this 'overall experience' opinion section, eight of the nine questions asked of the POMS FIT Count and 1km square survey participants were directly comparable with Birdsong's *Charity Pulse* sector benchmark* for volunteers.

The graphs for questions 13-20 show the PoMS participants' response percentages compared with the sector benchmark data (shown in dark blue). This comparison provides an extra layer of insight regarding the level of PoMS participant satisfaction.


Further note:

*The *Charity Pulse* benchmark comprises responses from more than 6,000 volunteers giving their time to charities based around the UK, spanning a variety of causes and types of volunteering work. It is compiled from data from all the Birdsong surveys involving volunteers that have taken place over the past three years.




14. The PoMS coordinators communicate regularly with me





15. I feel that my participation has made a difference (i.e. has helped to conserve insects)




16. I feel appreciated for my participation






17. I receive the training / guidance I need to participate in PoMS schemes




18. Overall, I am satisfied with my experience of PoMS


19. I am proud to participate in PoMS surveys




Challenges and obstacles for PoMS participants

All questionnaire respondents were asked a question about challenging factors that might be preventing them from being more involved than they currently are in PoMS. This information is to help UKCEH better understand how to support PoMS participants, including how to support people who are interested but have not yet participated.

The wording of the question differed slightly, depending on the respondent's participation status (a merged version is used below for the purpose of this Overall Results report). Respondents were asked to tick all challenges that apply to them.

The chart shows the responses in order of most answers given to least answers given:




